

# OPEN CLASS FLOWERS AND PLANTS

## Department 115

### RULES

1. See **Open Class Division General Rules on page 20.**
2. Exhibits must be grown, groomed, arranged and labeled correctly by the exhibitor. All flowers and plants must be clean and free from insects and disease.
3. Entries will be displayed in the 4-H Forum. Judging time will be at 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday.
4. Exhibitors must provide their own containers.
5. Only one exhibit per entry number.
6. Entries will be accepted between 2:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday. No exhibits will be accepted after 8:00 p.m. Exhibits must be in place until 7:00 p.m. on Sunday.
7. Large flowers should be shown in proportionate sized containers; small flowers growing on short stems in low bowl; long stem and spike flowers in tall containers.
8. Entries in **Class A and B** must be in clear containers. No additional foliage is to be added. Wedging is permitted. Wedging: use of small inconspicuous "plug" in neck of bottle to improve pose of specimen. i.e. plug of plastic wrap, styrofoam, wood, etc.
9. Entries in **Class C:**
  - a) Must be in good form to be viewed from all sides.
  - b) Entries must be fresh or natural dried products unless stated otherwise. Dried arrangements can only be entered one year.
  - c) No dyed or painted fresh material.
  - d) Entries may use any cultivated or wild foliage flower as a filler.
  - e) You may use fruits or vegetables in arrangements that have not been grown by the exhibitor.
10. Entries in **Class D** may be exhibited more than one year. Print name of plant on entry tag. Plants must have been grown by the exhibitor at least 3 months before the fair.
11. Entries in **Class E** must be grown by the exhibitor in a container 12" or less. Print name of plant on entry tag.

## **OPEN CLASS FINE ARTS**

**Department 118**

### **RULES**

1. **See Open Class Division General Rules on page 20.**
2. Only one exhibit per entry number.
3. Exhibits will be accepted between 2:00 and 8:00 p.m. Tuesday in the 4-H Forum. No exhibits will be accepted after 8:00 p.m. Tuesday. Exhibits must be in place until 7:00 p.m. Sunday. Exhibitors must have their claim checks to pick up exhibits.
4. Judging will begin at 9:00 a.m. Wednesday.
5. Only non-professional artists that are Waukesha or Milwaukee County residents are eligible to enter. (Non-professional is defined as any person whose income from the sale of art work is less than ½ of their total personal income.)
6. Entries must be original works of the exhibitor and must have been completed within the last year. Creativity is encouraged.
7. No commercial kits are allowed, except where indicated.
8. Two-dimensional entries must be securely and suitable wired for hanging using picture wire and screw eyes or suitable clips. Pictures cannot be larger than 36" x 36". Picture that are not on stretched canvas must be rigidly framed. If entries do not comply, they may be rejected for safety reasons.
9. All articles are exhibited at the owner's risk. The Fair management assumes no responsibility for losses. Entries should be removed promptly after the close of the Fair. The Waukesha County Fair Association, Inc., will take every precaution for their safekeeping, but will not be held responsible for any damage or accident that may occur.
10. Functional and non-functional definition: Functional items are intended to be used. Non-functional items are only for art display.
11. To assist in judging, attach a card to the entry tag with the following information. 1) The source of the idea for the entry. 2) Describe special techniques and processes. 3) Other considerations, such as the title. 4) Any accessories that are not made by the artist should be noted.
